**Go, Your Son Will Live**  
**John 4:43-54**

1. What part of the text/message had the greatest impact on you? Where were you most encouraged? Intrigued? Challenged?
2. How does this passage encourage us to approach Jesus in times of desperation?
3. Take time to read through Romans 8:24-25; 2 Cor. 4:17-18 and 5:7; Hebrews 11:1, 6 – and talk about how **“believing comes before seeing.”**
4. Have you ever found yourself in need of a miracle? How did God work in the situation? How did He work in your life through this situation?
5. Talk through the 4 principles of how to pray for a miracle:
  - Pray in faith and cling to the promises of God
  - Pray, knowing that God is always good – and that He even uses trials and tribulations for our good
  - As you pray, remember that He has not promised to heal us in this life
  - Entrust yourself and your loved ones to God
