

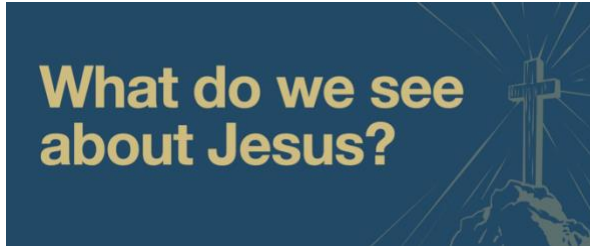

Come to Me and Drink
John 7:37-52

1. What ways does our culture offer to quench our thirsty souls? How do those not satisfy us ultimately?
2. How does the setting of the water ceremony in the temple on the last day of the feast (John 7:37) help us understand this passage?
3. Discuss how Jesus is fulfilling these Old Testament passages:
 - **Ezekiel 36:25–27**
 - **Joel 2:28-29**
 - **Zechariah 12:10; 13:1**
4. What does the imagery of “rivers of living water” convey about the Spirit’s work? How have you experienced the work of the Spirit recently in your own life?
5. How has the Spirit quenched your thirst and how have you been satisfied in Him?
6. How does this passage motivate us to share the good news with others? What opportunities do you have to “live satisfied” in front of others this week?

7. As we look in anticipation during this Easter week – meditate on this thought:

The one who said “if anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink” later said “I thirst” as he was dying on the cross (John 19:28), and the one who prophesied that “rivers of water” would flow out of believer’s hearts later had blood and water flow from His chest when a Roman soldier pierced his side (John 19:34). Jesus didn’t just declare these things to be true – He won them for us on the cross.
