


September 7th, 2025 "Now I See" John 9:18-41

	Can you think of modern parallels in our culture today where people remain silent about their faith out of fear of rejection, job loss, or social ostracism?
3.	How does the man's logical but humble defense contrast with the Pharisees' insults and rejection? What does this tell us about the difference between spiritual humility and spiritual pride?
4.	How does the man's faith progress throughout the chapter?
5.	Why is it significant that Jesus seeks out the man after he is cast out and what does this reveal about Jesus' care for those rejected by others?

6. What does Jesus mean when He says that those who think they see will become blind?

b. How do Jeremiah 5:21 and John 3:17–20 help us understand spiritual blindness?

a. How is willful blindness different from ignorance?
