1.	The sermon began with the heaviness of national and global violence. How can we mourn rightly as Christians without falling into despair? What does it mean to experience both righteous anger and godly compassion in response to injustice?
2.	Read through Ezekiel 34:7-16 and talk through God's action in the midst of failed leaders and their abuse of God's people?
	In what ways can we discern and follow true shepherds rather than hirelings?
3.	What is the significance of Jesus saying, "I AM the Door"? How does the metaphor of a shepherd and sheep help us understand this statement?
4.	Why do you think Jesus emphasized that the Pharisees were not the door?
5.	How does Jesus being the door of the sheepfold highlight His role as mediator (see 1 Timothy 2:5) and the way that He calls His followers to (see Matthew 7:13-14)?

6. How did this passage comfort, encourage, or challenge you to follow Jesus?
