


November 2nd, 2025 "What Are We To Do?" John 11:45-12:11

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1.	In what sense did Caiaphas "prophesy" without realizing it (John 11:49–52)? What does this passage teach about how God can accomplish His purposes even through sinful human motives?
2.	Why do people often react negatively when confronted by the holiness and authority of Jesus?
	In what ways was Jesus a threat to the power structures of His day—both religious and political?
	How can Jesus also feel like a "threat" to our own personal comfort, habits, or priorities?
3.	What made Mary's act of anointing Jesus extravagant?
4.	Why did Judas criticize her, and what does this reveal about his heart?

5. What does *extravagant worship* look like in your life? What might Mary's devotion teach us about how to worship Jesus today (in ways that are costly, personal, and unashamed)?

6. How were you convicted, encouraged, or challenged by Mary's example in John 12?
