Hebrews 10:1-10

1. Which point from Sunday's sermon challenged, convicted, or encouraged you the most?
2. What does Hebrews 10:4 mean when it says, **"it is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins"**? Why was an animal not ultimately a sufficient substitute for a human sinner?
3. What does John the Baptist mean when he calls Jesus "the Lamb of God" in John 1:29? What similarities do you see between Jesus and the sacrificial lambs of the Old Testament?
4. What does Jesus' death tell us about both the seriousness of sin and the depth of God's mercy? (see 1 Peter 2:24-25)
5. What did Jesus do after His sacrifice on the cross (see Hebrews 10:11-12)? Why is this significant?
6. In what ways are people today tempted to rely on religious activity instead of Christ's finished work? In other words, what areas of your life are you tempted to "earn" God's acceptance rather than rest in Christ?
7. How can this passage help you share the gospel with someone who believes good works earn God's favor?
