*Faced with God*  
Job 42:1-6

1. Which point from Sunday's sermon challenged, convicted, or encouraged you the most?
2. What attributes of God revealed throughout the summer series are especially important when facing unanswered questions?
3. Why is a generic belief in “a God who wants me to be happy” insufficient when someone enters a season of deep suffering?
4. The sermon emphasizes that Job was seeing only “1 or 2” things while God was doing “1,000 things.” How does that illustrate the difference between God's perspective and ours?
5. Job says, “I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you.” What changed in Job? What is the difference between knowing things about God and seeing the living God? (see John 1:14, 2 Cor. 3:18)
6. Think about an unanswered question or difficult circumstance in your own life. What would it look like to trust God with that question rather than demand an answer from Him?
7. How can you walk alongside others who are going through unexplained trials? What is the danger of becoming overly confident about what God is doing in someone else's suffering?
