<u>Precept Upon Precept-Hebrews</u> You Didn't Quit and God Is Not Ashamed, Lesson 23

Run the race.

- O Hebrews 10:32-36: "But remember the former days, when, after being enlightened, you endured a great conflict of sufferings, partly by being made a public spectacle through insults and distress, and partly by becoming companions with those who were so treated. For you showed sympathy to the prisoners and accepted joyfully the seizure of your property, knowing that you have for yourselves a better and lasting possession. Therefore, do not throw away your confidence, which has a great reward. For you have need of endurance, so that when you have done the will of God, you may receive what was promised."
- O Hebrews 12:1-3: "Therefore, since we also have such a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let's rid ourselves of every obstacle and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let's run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking only at Jesus, the originator and perfecter of the faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. For consider Him who has endured such hostility by sinners against Himself, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart."
- Hebrews 11:39: "And all these, having gained approval through their faith, did not receive what was promised."
- Hebrews 11:16: "But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one.
 Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; for He has prepared a city for them."
- There is a race to be run that requires endurance; as you run God is cheering you on.
- Summary of last lesson: Faith takes God at His word, Faith does not underestimate the power of God's Word, Faith attains the righteousness of salvation through sacrifice and not works, Faith never sees death, Faith prepares, Faith obeys, Faith lives as an alien, Faith receives ability, Faith lives as a pilgrim and a stranger.
- God is not ashamed to be called our God.
 - O Hebrews 11:13: "All these died in faith, without receiving the promises, but having seen them and having welcomed them from a distance, and having confessed that they were strangers and exiles on the earth For those who say such things make it clear that they are seeking a country of their own. And indeed if they had been thinking of that country from which they went out, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; for He has prepared a city for them."

• True faith passed the test.

- Hebrews 11:17-19: "By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was offering up his only begotten son; it was he to whom it was said, "In Isaac your descendants shall be called." He considered that God is able to raise people even from the dead, from which he also received him back as a type."
- Genesis 22:1-3: "Now it came about after these things, that God tested Abraham, and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." Then He said, "Take now your son, your only son, whom you love, Isaac, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I will tell you." So Abraham got up

- early in the morning and saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him and his son Isaac; and he split wood for the burnt offering, and set out and went to the place of which God had told him."
- First time God uses the word 'love' and 'worship'
- o Faith is not faith without being tested.
- Hebrews 11:20: "By faith Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau, even regarding things to come."
- Hebrews 11:21: "By faith Jacob, as he was dying, blessed each of the sons of Joseph, and worshiped, leaning on the top of his staff."
- Hebrews 11:22: "By faith Joseph, when he was dying, made mention of the exodus of the sons of Israel, and gave orders concerning his bones."
- O Hebrews 11:23-26: "By faith Moses, when he was born, was hidden for three months by his parents, because they saw he was a beautiful child; and they were not afraid of the king's edict. By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, choosing rather to endure ill-treatment with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin, considering the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures of Egypt; for he was looking to the reward."
- O Hebrews 11:27-29: "By faith he left Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king; for he endured, as seeing Him who is unseen. By faith he kept the Passover and the sprinkling of the blood, so that he who destroyed the firstborn would not touch them. By faith they passed through the Red Sea as though they were passing through dry land; and the Egyptians, when they attempted it, were drowned."
- It is a reproach to belong to Christ in this world.
- o There is a difference between faith and presumption.
- Hebrews 11:30-31: "By faith the walls of Jericho fell down after they had been encircled for seven days. By faith Rahab the harlot did not perish along with those who were disobedient, after she had welcomed the spies in peace."
- Hebrews 11:32-33: "And what more shall I say? For time will fail me if I tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets, who by faith conquered kingdoms, performed acts of righteousness, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions."
- Hebrews 11:34-35: "Quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, from weakness were made strong, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight.
 Women received back their dead by resurrection; and others were tortured, not accepting their release, so that they might obtain a better resurrection."
- Faith does not always deliver us from present trials but it always brings God's approval.
 - O Hebrews 11:36-40: "others experienced mockings and scourgings, yes, also chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were tempted, they were put to death with the sword; they went about in sheepskins, in goatskins, being destitute, afflicted, ill-treated (men of whom the world was not worthy), wandering in deserts and mountains and caves and holes in the ground. And all these, having gained approval through their faith, did not receive what was promised, because God had provided something better for us, so that apart from us they would not be made perfect."
