

Precept Upon Precept-Hebrews

Continuance in The Faith Is the Evidence Of Your Salvation, Lesson 10

- Continuance in faith is evidence of salvation
 - Hebrews 3:1-3: “Therefore, holy brethren, partakers of a heavenly calling, consider Jesus, the Apostle and High Priest of our confession; He was faithful to Him who appointed Him, as Moses also was in all His house. For He has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses, by just so much as the builder of the house has more honor than the house.”
 - Hebrews 3:4-6: “For every house is built by someone, but the builder of all things is God. Now Moses was faithful in all His house as a servant, for a testimony of those things which were to be spoken later but Christ was faithful as a Son over His house—whose house we are, if we hold fast our confidence and the boast of our hope firm until the end.”
 - Hebrews 3:7-10, The Israelites failed many times to believe God even though they saw his works.
 - Hebrews 3:12-14: “Take care, brethren, that there not be in any one of you an evil, unbelieving heart that falls away from the living God. But encourage one another day after day, as long as it is still called “Today,” so that none of you will be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. For we have become partakers of Christ, if we hold fast the beginning of our assurance firm until the end.”
 - Hebrews 6:9: “But, beloved, we are convinced of better things concerning you, and things that accompany salvation, though we are speaking in this way.”
 - Hebrews 10:36-39: “For you have need of endurance, so that when you have done the will of God, you may receive what was promised... But we are not of those who shrink back to destruction, but of those who have faith to the preserving of the soul.”
 - Hebrews 10:32-35, You were going through a trial knowing that you have an abiding possession.
 - Hebrews 2:1-3, Pay close attention so you do not drift away
 - Hebrews 3:6, You must hold fast in your boasting of hope
- Are people losing their salvation in Hebrews?
 - Let the author explain what he means
 - John 6:26-27: “Jesus answered them and said, “Truly, truly, I say to you, you seek Me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate of the loaves and were filled. Do not work for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give to you, for on Him the Father, God, has set His seal.””
 - John 6:31-32: “ Our fathers ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, ‘He gave them bread out of heaven to eat.’” Jesus then said to them...“it is My Father who gives you the true bread out of heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down out of heaven, and gives life to the world.” Then they said to Him, “Lord, always give us this bread. “Jesus said to them, “I am the bread of life;

he who comes to Me will not hunger, and he who believes in Me will never thirst. But I said to you that you have seen Me, and yet do not believe.”

- John 6:37-38: “All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will certainly not cast out. For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me.”
- John 6:39-40: “This is the will of Him who sent Me, that of all that He has given Me I lose nothing, but raise it up on the last day. For this is the will of My Father, that everyone who beholds the Son and believes in Him will have eternal life, and I Myself will raise him up on the last day.”
- John 6:41-46, No one comes to Jesus unless the Father draws them
- John 6:57-58: “As the living Father sent Me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats Me, he also will live because of Me. This is the bread which came down out of heaven; not as the fathers ate and died; he who eats this bread will live forever.”
- John 6:65: “And He was saying, “For this reason I have said to you, that no one can come to Me unless it has been granted him from the Father.””
- John 6:66-68: “As a result of this many of His disciples withdrew and were not walking with Him anymore. So Jesus said to the twelve, “You do not want to go away also, do you?” Simon Peter answered Him, “Lord, to whom shall we go? You have words of eternal life.””
- Luke 9:1-2: “And He called the twelve together, and gave them power and authority over all the demons and to heal diseases. And He sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to perform healing.”
 - Jesus knew when he chose Judas that he would fall away.
- Isaiah 8:18: “Behold, I and the children whom the Lord has given me are for signs and wonders in Israel from the Lord of hosts, who dwells on Mount Zion.”
- John 10:22-26, Jesus says people do not believe because they are not of his sheep.
- John 10:27-29, Jesus’ sheep know his voice, follow him, and will never perish.
- Ephesians 1:3-4: “Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ, just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we would be holy and blameless before Him.”
- Ephesians 1:13: “In Him, you also, after listening to the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation—having also believed, you were sealed in Him with the Holy Spirit of promise.”
- Ephesians 2:8-10, We have been saved through faith and should produce works.
- Romans 8:28-30, Whom God foreknew he also predestined to become conformed to the image of his Son.
- I John 3:7-8: “Little children, make sure no one deceives you; the one who practices righteousness is righteous, just as He is righteous; the one who practices sin is of the devil; for the devil has sinned from the beginning.”
- I John 3:8-10, No one who is a child of God is a habitual sinner.
- I John 2:19, If they had been with us, they would have remained.
